**February in Vietnam is the season for Tet**, the main holiday on the Vietnamese calendar and so things slowed down a little then.

In March, Tim Kemp and Adam Barrett from Maffra, conducted an AUSTSWIM Train the Trainer program at **Hong Bang University**International in HCMC for 55 candidates.

Jan Williams is all booked and ready to go in April to assist local teachers teach their children at **St Josephs, Bien Hoa,** a small charity school in Dong Nai Province. (This Province has the fifth highest drowning rate in Vietnam).

All of the **new programs** initiated in 2014 want us back and so programs are planned at:

- Blue Dragon Children's Foundation in Hanoi. Gail Mortimer and Bec Schatz from Geelong will continue the work started last year.
- 2. **Hoa Hoi in Xuyen Moc District.** Jan Williams will continue the work here with these schools.
- 3. **Tra Tan in Binh Thuan District**. Last year our teachers travelled 140 km north east of HCMC to Tra Tan and ended up with 80 kids in the water! This year we will concentrate on teacher training and improving the water quality in the pools.
- 4. **Zenna Resort.** (Between Vung Tau and Ho Tram, on the coast) Marilla Gorman will lead this training. Again our focus will be on training school teachers from the surrounding district.
- 5. **Than Thach in Ben Tre**. (Mekong) From our association with Heartreach, an Australian NGO, this school was recommended. Riahana Wilon and Sam Harris will develop this program and we hope to include at least one other school.

## **Ho Tram Community Pool**

We will continue to support and advise as required at Ho Tram. Marilla Gorman is booked for June school holidays. A brand new school is opening close to the pool and so we hope to involve those children in swimming for safety, health and fun.



# It has truly been a team effort

We sincerely thank our amazing volunteer swim teachers who work under extremely difficult conditions in some instances. They are just so prepared to do anything they possibly can to enhance the WSV name and reputation in Vietnam.

Our AYAD (Australian Youth Ambassador for Development) volunteer, Molly Ferrier, from Perth, has been steadily working away in her role as Water Safety Officer. This funding is from AUSAID. Molly has been visiting schools spreading the water safety message and assisting Mr Loi at the pool.

- Sent 44 teachers to Vietnam
- Recruited 8 from within
- Taught 1000 kids to swim
- Trained 341 local adults
- Trained 8 assessors
- Trained 264 adults in CPR.

We are very proud of this achievement.

Our Australian volunteers are passionate about what we do. We also get so much help from our enthusiastic **Vietnamese volunteers** who assist in many ways, including translating, transporting, interpreting and making us welcome into their homes.
