

WSV December 2016 NEWSLETTER We've all been so busy and it's been a great year for WSV and the children we teach in Vietnam. Since our last newsletter in May:

- 1. Jason Horton and Adam Barratt travelled 140 km north east of HCMC to **Tra Tan in Binh Thuan District** to assist the local teachers and also to conduct a swim program for kinder kids who missed out last year.
- 2. Schools in the Xuyen Moc District conducted teacher training and a summer swim program for 45 teachers and more than 100 kids. Jan Williams conducted the teacher training and Duc Toan Luu, Georgia Small, Nicole Kruger and Kellie Presnell were invaluable to the success of the program.
- **3.** Jan and Kellie then went on to **Vung Tau** to assist teachers run a program for Grade 3 children.
- **4.** Duc Toan Luu, Riahna Wilson and Sam Harris returned to assist the local teachers at **Than Thach in Ben Tre Province** teach 50 kids again this year.
- **5.** Ho Tram Water Safety Consortium requested that we train more teachers in anticipation of a big turn -out for the Summer Holiday period. Tim Kemp assisted by Adam and Jason conducted this training. Darryl Beales also conducted a Surf Water Safety day for 30 children in October.
- 6. In October we received an urgent request to train more teachers in **Xuyen Moc District** and to assist them to conduct swim programs as part of the school curriculum. This is what we have been trying to achieve over the past 5 years!

Gail Mortimer returned to Vietnam and with the assistance of Darryl Beales, Duc Toan Luu, Thuy Nguyen and Natasha Vaughan, assisted the local PE teachers at 3 schools to conduct swim programs for 250 kids for the first time in these schools.
