These little Children are so quick to learn! Ho Tram Water Safety Consortium has requested that we train more teachers in anticipation of a big turn -out for the Summer Holiday period.

New programs for 2016 have also been introduced to Phan Thiet and Vinh Long Province. So the momentum is still growing with more and more people realizing in Vietnam that if children learn to swim and be safe near water, this knowledge could some day save their life.

With all this activity, it has been necessary to appoint six Project Co Ordinators to manage the day to day planning and administration of our programs. It is with great pleasure that we have appointed two young Vietnamese Co Ordinators, Sophie Le and Ducc Toan Luu to join our team.

Most of our 2016 teacher training and swimming programs in Vietnam are now confirmed and already we've had some great successes.

1. Sophie Le and Ben Asmussen started the year by assisting local teachers teach their children at St Josephs, Bien Hoa, in Dong Nai Province. It's great to know that this program is now almost entirely run by local swim teachers.
2. Tim Kemp and trainers from Swim Vietnam conducted training in HCMC with Physical Education students from Hong Bang University International and the University of Physical Education and Sport. These PE teachers go out to many Provinces once they graduate. We hope that this will ensure many children are taught to swim in Vietnam within the school system.
3. Schools in the Xuyen Moc District have planned a summer swim program. Jan Williams and other teachers will be there to help out.
4. The Vung Tau People's Committee and local education authorities wish to continue the program started last year. Just the one Primary school in Vung Tau has 8 Grade 3 classes, each with 40 kids!
5. Jason Horton and Adam Barratt will travel 140 km north east of HCMC to Tra Tan in Binh Thuan District to assist the local teachers and also to conduct a swim program for kinder kids who missed out last year.
6. Ducc Toan Luu, Riahana Wilson and Sam Harris will return to assist the local teachers at Than Thach in Ben Tre again this year.
9. We conducted our first ever Kindergarten program at Ho Tram Community Pool last October and will return this year. These little Children are so quick to learn!
